

NEHEMIAH PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Nehemiah Project is part of the Healing and Transition (HAT) program, a faith-based community wide reentry initiative serving men and women returning to our communities following incarceration. Although not a residential program, participants meet Monday through Friday for a period of four consecutive weeks.

OUR PURPOSE

- Serving men released from jail, prison or half-way houses within 120 days after release.
- Services provided at no cost to participants

OUR PROGRAM

Prepares men to succeed and empowers families to become self-sufficient, thus strengthening the community through:

- Pre-release services in jail
- Character and faith development through experiential learning
- Individual Transition Plans (ITP)

Mission Statement:

To provide a safe place where men can come and receive biblical whole life training translating into impacting the whole man.

Vision Statement

To build a solid foundation on which Returning Citizens can choose to rebuild themselves and bring true healing to themselves, others and society.

Transition Coaches and Positive Connections

Each program participant is connected to a Transition Coach (TC) and a Station of Hope (SOH), a local house of worship, during their orientation phase. Transition Coaches are trained volunteers and become part of the Returning Citizen's transition team. The primary role of the Transition Team is to:

- Provide weekly coaching sessions for Returning Citizens
- Provide positive connections to the Returning Citizen
- Provide opportunities for mentee's to participate in classes and events at their SOH
- Provide service opportunities within the community for their mentee's
- Provide accountability and encourage positive structure
